

WHAT IS A METHODIST?

Methodists have a Wesleyan theology. This means that we follow the beliefs of John and Charles Wesley to help us understand who, and whose, we are. Our primary sources for understanding Wesleyan thought are the sermons of John Wesley as well as the hymns of his brother, Charles. The first thing they tell us is that the Bible is our primary source of reference and illumination.

Moving beyond that basic affirmation of Holy Scripture, God's grace is considered to be the cornerstone of Wesleyan Though the tendency in the belief. modern world is to claim and marvel in God's grace and in companionship with Jesus Christ, for Wesley, thoughts about grace begin with a sober appreciation of our need for God's grace. Although people like to think of themselves as basically good (thereby needing God's grace only to make life a little better), Wesley clearly understood and taught that we are sinful by nature, and hopelessly lost without God's grace. Through God's grace, we are rescued from the power of sin and death.

In this strong emphasis on God's grace, Wesley spoke of the dimensions of God's grace given in three ways – prevenient grace, the grace that enables us even within our sinful state to turn to God; justifying grace, the grace that sets us in a right relationship with God; and sanctifying grace, the grace that guides and sustains us as we grow and mature along our Christian pilgrimage in life.

Though written by the daughter of a Presbyterian pastor, Methodists certainly appreciate the familiar words of a favorite hymn – "Marvelous, infinite, matchless grace freely, bestowed on all who believe!" Next, we'll look a little closer at the Wesleyan understanding of the implications of grace for Christian living. Meanwhile remember, God loves you; and so do l.


