On Thursday, October 12 a Kairos team of interdenominational volunteers will go into Camille Griffin Graham Correctional Institute for the 56th time to sponsor a weekend spiritual retreat. This state prison, located on Broad River Road here in Columbia, is a maximum security facility for over 800 women. The retreat takes much prayer, a large team (inside and outside), detailed planning, financial help and lots of cookies and saltys. The cost of the weekend is about \$9,000.

While the retreat is for 42 participants, everyone from the warden down receives a bag of cookies each day with a Scripture verse in the bag. The bags of cookies represent the unconditional love that Christ teaches us to share -AGAPE.

Prison is a dark, hopeless place. Inmates often live their lives without friends, without family, staring at the prison bars and feeling guilt and anger burning in their hearts. Through the work of over 30,000 volunteers, Kairos Prison Ministry brings the light, love and friendship of Jesus Christ into their lives.

Kairos had its beginning in 1976, when a group of nine men went into a prison in Raiford, Florida for "a short course in Christianity." The program caught on, and it was named Kairos (Greek for God's Special Time).

Today, Kairos International is supported by a staff of nine and over 30,000 volunteers who donate more than 3 million hours of service each year. These volunteers serve in over 400 correctional institutions and 86 communities in 35 states and nine foreign countries.

In South Carolina, Kairos is active in 10 men's and two women's prisons. We have over 16,000 volunteers and no paid staff. Weekends are held twice a year. Reunions (a very important part of Kairos) are held monthly.

Through Kairos Prison Ministry prisoners learn that they are worthy of God's love, light and grace, and that no matter who they are or what they have done, God's forgiving grace is available for all.

# THE KAIROS PRISON MINISTRY NEEDS YOUR HELP

## Cookie and Salty Instructions:

1. Boxes are available for the cookies in the narthex with instructions and recipes included. Sturdy boxes are fine. Be sure and let the cookies cool completely before packing them (they crumble) Use waxed paper between the layers. Dropped or rolled cookies should be made with diameter of 2 - 2.5 inches.. Small cookies do not break as easily as large ones. Please do not make crisp cookies as they will break. We can use dropped cookies, rolled cookies and bar cookies.



2. Large packages of “store bought cookies” in their original wrap are appreciated. No individual size packages, please.

3. We will be collecting large bags of “salty treats,” i.e. vegetable sticks, corn chips, pretzels, pork rinds, nuts, trail mix, etc. No potato chips (they crumble). No individual size bags, please.

4. Members of the NEUMC family are asked to sign the slips of construction paper in the narthex. These slips will be made into a colorful chain that circles the gym where our retreat is held. The women will love the chain. A request for prayer accompanies the slips of paper.

5. We encourage everyone to sign our prayer vigil schedule in the narthex and pray for our weekend in the prison.

Cookie pick up is Tuesday, October 10 by 3 PM at the church.
