

Revelation 7:9-17

**9** After this I looked, and there before me was a great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, tribe, people and language, standing before the throne and before the Lamb. They were wearing white robes and were holding palm branches in their hands. 10 And they cried out in a loud voice: "Salvation belongs to our God, who sits on the throne, and to the Lamb." II All the angels were standing around the throne and around the elders and the four living creatures. They fell down on their faces before the throne and worshiped God, 12 saying: "Amen! Praise and glory and wisdom and thanks and honor and power and strength be to our God for ever and ever. Amen!" 13 Then one of the elders asked me, "These in white robes—who are they, and where did they come from?" I4 I answered, "Sir, you know." And he said, "These are they who have come out of the great tribulation; they have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb. 15 Therefore. "they are before the throne of God and serve him day and night in his temple; and he who sits on the throne will shelter them with his presence. 16 'Never again will they hunger; never again will they thirst. The sun will not beat down on them,' nor any scorching heat. 17 For the Lamb at the center of the throne will be their shepherd; 'he will lead them to springs of living water.' 'And God will wipe away every tear from their eyes."

# Thanks to You, Brianna is Winning

Seventeen-year-old Brianna\* came to live at Epworth three years ago. She and a sibling had been taken into protective custody after social workers discovered they were being physically abused by an adult in the home.

Reserved by nature and highly intelligent, Brianna was failing all her classes and getting into fights. She had come to distrust adults, felt powerless over everything, and resented peers who, unlike her, had been blessed with secure, less complicated childhoods.

Epworth counselors worked intensively with Brianna to help her deal with her accumulated trauma, fear and rage. They helped her understand that none of the abuse she endured was her fault. Along with Epworth's faith formation director, the counselors also helped Brianna realize that she is a beloved child of God who deserves all the beautiful gifts life can offer. They taught her to focus on con-

trolling the things she could – such as school attendance, the effort she invested in her assignments, and participation in extracurricular activities. Epworth tutors worked closely with her to help her catch up with her peers in school. Our activities director saw that Brianna was a naturally fast runner, so he encouraged her to sign up for a team sport.

In a few weeks, Brianna will graduate with honors. She is proud of the letter she earned from excelling in soccer. She is also proud of saving some money from her weekend job, which will come in handy when she starts college this fall.

In partnership with you, Epworth transforms the lives of many deserving young people like Brianna every year. Thank you for supporting this year's Mother's Day offering.
